Within Community Programs, the AmeriCorps member will support our goal of connecting residents with social services, jobs and resources through our Walk to Work program, as well as creating a healthier, more family-friendly neighborhood through the Fenway Family Coalition. The SCI AmeriCorps member will engage in a combination of activities including:

- Recruiting volunteers and attendees for health, wellness, workforce development, and financial empowerment workshops, including Walk to Work, Fair Foods, and the Fenway Family Coalition programs;
- Building Fenway CDC's food programs in the community by coordinating a recipe demonstration and nutrition education program and expanding food resources to complement our existing biweekly Fair Foods offering;
- Coordinating with local universities to promote student civic engagement and coordinate service-learning opportunities;
- Facilitating and troubleshooting the utilization of Fenway CDC's CiviCRM database software system to streamline stakeholder communications, track data, and increase information sharing;
- Conducting one-on-ones, door-knocking, and community meetings and facilitate ongoing communication to existing and potential members through social media (Facebook, e-newsletter, website and etc.) to inform, educate, and mobilize residents, attract volunteers and connect them with CDC activities and programs;
- Coordinating logistics and volunteers for career and resource fairs and workshops;
- Managing a member engagement rewards program with Union Capital Boston;
- Designing a volunteer outreach and engagement plan aiming to increase the capacity of volunteers, promote volunteer appreciation, and develop a communications plan that includes overall outreach and resident engagement; and
- Assisting on additional projects as support for special events, such as the FCDC Annual Meeting and the Fenway Ball, while building improved processes and documentation along the way.

Fenway CDC hopes to recruit more active volunteers and members to support our civic engagement efforts. These activities will build capacity within Fenway CDC and increase civic engagement within the Fenway community, which is increasingly pressured by a growing student presence and rising living costs.
