I have been instrumental in bringing the first non-profit childcare center to the Fenway, and Fenway CDC will be soon be hosting a new skills training center in our backyard.

We are routinely sought out as affordable housing experts and serve on many task forces and coalitions throughout the City.

I am going to enjoy my retirement knowing that we have a stellar group of senior staff and board leadership who will take Fenway CDC into the future. With a robust housing pipeline, progress on passing life changing laws for those most vulnerable, and a new strategic plan to chart a future path, I encourage you to stay involved knowing that you can make a lasting difference as well.
