Affordable Housing Development & Preservation

- 112 Queensberry Street construct 6 story building consisting of 24 units for low-income residents
- Our Lady's Guild House renovate 140 single room occupancy unit building to 86 units for low-income residents and formerly homeless residents
- 43 Hemenway Street create affordable home ownership opportunities for 6 low-income households, increasing Fenway's affordable home ownership by 33%
- 72 Burbank Street build 27 units, first ground-up new construction in decades, slated to be completed in 2024

Resident Services & Workforce Development:

- 650 residents will have safe and affordable homes
- 350 residents will get eviction prevention services, social services, skills training, employment, education, financial coaching, computer training, and attend Career Fair
- 450 residents will receive fresh healthy food to address food insecurity
- 950 residents will be engaged in arts and cultural events to enrich their lives

Community Planning & Organizing:
